A History and Architecture Course

Required time: approx. 2 hours

- Uragashira Hikiage Peace Park and Memorial Museum
- Hario Radio Tower

Reaching into the sky, 100 years of memories



2 Hario Radio Tower
A historic Japanese communications facility marking 100 years since its construction. Three gigantic towers, each about 136 meters tall, are arranged in an equilateral triangle, and the view when looking straight up from below is truly impressive.

A spectacular viewpoint where you can feel the power of whirlpools



3 Saikai Bashi Bridge / Shin-Saikai Bashi Bridge
The Saikai Bashi Bridge, with a total length of 316 meters, is a famous spot known for the rapid currents and whirlpools of Harioseto, one of Japan's three major tidal rapids. From the pedestrian walkway of the adjacent Shin-Saikai Bashi Bridge, you can enjoy the powerful sight of whirlpools directly below through the glass floor.



4 Oedo Onsen Monogatari Premium Saikaibashi
Relax in the spectacular open-air baths and large communal baths that seem to merge with Omura Bay. No reservation required, towel rental available, making it easy to soothe travel fatigue.

A place where history lives on and peace is wished for

1 Uragashira Hikiage Peace Park and Memorial Museum
A historic site where approximately 1.4 million people returned to their homeland after the war. In 1986, it was developed as a park dedicated to peace, with an attached museum. In spring, the park is adorned with cherry blossoms in full bloom.

A place to encounter 400 years of craftsmanship and beauty

6 Mikawachi Ceramics Museum
Mikawachi ware, a nationally designated traditional craft with a history of approximately 400 years. At the Mikawachi Ceramics Museum, you can enjoy the appeal of Mikawachi ware all at once, from antique works handed down through the ages to pieces by contemporary artisans.

A History and Architecture Course

Required time: approx. 2 hours

A course to enjoy century-old giant towers and two bridges spanning one of Japan's three major rapid currents

1 Uragashira Hikiage Peace Park and Memorial Museum

A park with a history of being used as a repatriation port from overseas territories in 1945. In spring, the surrounding rows of cherry trees come into full bloom, and it is also known as a famous cherry blossom spot. Amid the beautiful scenery, you can feel thoughts of peace.

2 Hario Radio Tower

A historic communications facility that still towers in its original form even now, 100 years after its construction. It was designated a National Important Cultural Property in 2013. Guided tours by the preservation society are also offered, and it is known as a filming location for movies and TV dramas.

3 Saikai Bashi Bridge / Shin-Saikai Bashi Bridge

The Saikai Bashi Bridge, with a total length of 316 meters, is a famous spot at Harioseito, known for its fierce currents and whirlpools and counted as one of Japan's "three major rapid currents." The adjacent Shin-Saikai Bashi Bridge has a pedestrian walkway, where you can enjoy a powerful view of whirlpools directly below through a glass floor. From the walkway, you can also see the Hario Radio Tower, allowing you to fully enjoy Sasebo's uniquely dynamic scenery.

3 Saikai Bashi Bridge / Shin-Saikai Bashi Bridge

Saikai Bashi Park is equipped with a children's athletic playground and an observation deck. In spring, about 1,000 cherry trees come into full bloom, making it a perfect photo spot. During the cherry blossom season, the "Uzushio Festival," where you can enjoy powerful rapids and whirlpools, is held, and the area becomes lively with many food stalls.
